La Petite École, San Diego, California January 2008 – July 2013

English and ESL teacher (pre-K)

The French educational system requires schools to offer English lessons as a part of their normal curriculum. In this context it was my responsibility to plan and lead daily 45-minute English sessions for the four-year old level classes. The student body is comprised of children of mixed international backgrounds, some speaking fluent English, some with limited English and some with no English at all.

The goal of this course is to bring the children over the course of the year to a level of English proficiency that would enable them to integrate easily into a class of native English speaking Americans. I employed a variety of methods and teaching techniques to achieve this end and to encourage interaction (*e.g.* storybooks, games, puppets, craft-making, songs, cooking and cultural events).

Teacher's aide (pre-K)

The children in these classes are two and three year olds. The primary language of instruction is French. In this role, I assisted the lead teacher by sharing her responsibilities and carrying out the tasks she assigned to me.

My responsibilities included:

- Leading morning activities (*e.g.* orienting children to the days of the week, the calendar, seasons and holidays, counting, reading a story, singing, "noticing," show-and-tell, etc.)
- Providing primary care for children (*e.g.* toilet training, personal hygiene, etc.)
- Supervising children during lunch, recess, and nap time
- Organizing and leading cooking, music, and art activities

In addition to my role in the pre-K classroom, I was also in charge of planning activities for and supervision of children (ages two to four years) during the after-school day-care and full-time summer day-care programs.
